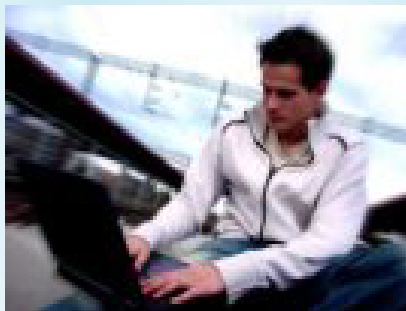


FAQ for prospective Professional Volunteers
